

## Ahijah: Grace is not a License (1 Kings 11:26, 29-40) Truth to Power (Part 2)

#### THE BIG IDEA

God's grace is not a license for us to do whatever we want. Instead, God's grace is a call for us to live in humble obedience to God.

- When did you get your driver's license?
- What other licenses do you have?

# **DIGGING DEEPER**

- Read 1 Kings 2:1-4 and then 11:1-10. How did Solomon fail to keep his covenant promises to God? In what ways did Solomon treat God's grace as a license to do whatever he wanted?
- Read 1 Kings 11:33-35. How did the people of Israel follow Solomon's example? What was the consequence of this?
- What does God promise to Jeroboam in 1 Kings 11:37-38? What is God's promise conditional on? How well did Jeroboam live up to this in 1 Kings 12:26-32?
- Read Romans 5:20-6:7. What happens when sin abounds? Why is the abundance of grace not a license to sin? What does our Christian baptism signify as it relates to sin?



• Read Jude 1:4.<sup>1</sup> How were some people distorting the grace of God?

### **PUTTING IT TO WORK**

 Rather than thinking of freedom from sin as a right to do whatever we want to do, Paul envisions freedom from sin as freedom to live as a servant of God. Spend time this week praying this Servant's Prayer

Give me a servant's heart, O Lord; A soul that longs for you, A spirit that daily seeks your will, And strength to follow through.

Give me ears to listen To the cries that go unheard, A mouth that speaks in kindness And proclaims your perfect word.

Give me eyes to see the things That grieve your only Son And hands that reach out for the lost Until your work is done.

Give me legs that carry me Swiftly through the race, And when I'm finished let me leave Footprints marked with grace.<sup>2</sup>
