

Isaiah: God Answers Prayer (2 Kings 20:1-6) Truth to Power (Part 11)

THE BIG IDEA

God takes our prayers into account as God works out his divine plan.

OPENING

- What's an example of an unanswered prayer in your life?
- Have you ever regretted a prayer after receiving an answer?

DIGGING DEEPER

- How does this passage illustrate the tension between God's sovereignty and our prayers?
- God's sovereignty refers to "God's ultimate lordship and rule over the universe so that the divine will is supreme over all else."¹ What does this biblical doctrine imply about our lives?
- Read 2 Chronicles 32:34-35; 2 Kings 20:12-19. What were some of the bad consequences of Hezekiah's additional 15 years?
- Read 1 John 5:14-15. What does this passage teach us about what to pray for?
